# Who we are

The east of England covers six counties, that's around 7,500 square miles. Providing a 24/7 emergency service that meets the demands of such a vast area is a huge undertaking, but at the East of England Ambulance Service we do just that.

Members of our team are out there now, working across 130 sites and alongside 17 acute hospital trusts. The service we provide is specifically tailored to meet the differing needs of our diverse local communities, whether they're on the coast, in the city, situated near a major road or airport or based in rural farmland.

### Our team includes:

- over 5,000 staff and more than 1,200 volunteers three Emergency Operations Centres (EOCs) located in Bedford, Chelmsford and Norwich
- 485 front line ambulances
- 72 rapid response vehicles
- 178 non-emergency ambulances
- 53 Hazardous Area Response Team/major incident/resilience vehicles.

### Not just blue lights

There's more to us than just emergency response though. We also provide non-emergency patient transport services for patients travelling to and from hospital, treatment centres and other similar facilities who can't travel unaided because of a medical condition or frailty.

Our frontline effort is supported by a huge team of support staff, specialising in everything from HR, finance and communications, to engineering, I.T and informatics. They're crucial to what we do, and there would be no frontline response without them.

# Volunteer roles

Here at EEAST the volunteer roles and opportunities on offer include:

#### **Community First Response**

Our **community first responder (CFR)** volunteers are trained by us to attend certain types of emergency call in the area where they live or work. Their aim is to reach a potential life-threatening emergency in the first vital minutes before the ambulance crew arrives.

As well as being a responder we also have volunteering opportunities for **CFR dispatchers, team leaders and trainers**.

### **Co-response**

Our **co-response volunteers** join us from other blue light services, or the armed forces and offer additional support at periods of extreme pressure and high demand.

#### **EEAST Heart**

Our **EEAST Heart volunteers** go out into the community to deliver emergency first aid training to their local schools and community groups.

#### **Community Engagement Group**

Our **Community Engagement Group** (CEG) is an independent group of volunteers from around the region who help us identify ways of improving services and support us with a range of activities, including audits and public engagement. The CEG is our critical friend.

#### **Patient Transport Services**

Our **volunteer car drivers** live and work in the local community and they give up their time to assist patients who need to get to and from hospital appointments, treatment centres and other health facilities.

Our Patient Transport Service also covers **hospital porter** volunteering opportunities, which involves supporting the patient in getting from the ambulance to the clinic doors, and back again.



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For anyone looking to volunteer within the East of England Ambulance Service NHS Trust, I would very much recommend it.

I really enjoy working with other volunteers across the region, in partnership with the Trust, to continuously improve the services for our patients whilst also ensuring that staff and volunteer wellbeing is prioritised.
